

SUBJECT: Central Valley Salinity Coalition Membership

The San Joaquin River Group Authority (SJRGA) appreciates the opportunity we had to attend the CV-SALTS Leadership Workshop and learn more about future Coalition and stakeholder efforts to develop a salt management plan for the Central Valley. The SJRGA has been an active stakeholder participant since the inception of the CV-SALTS program and will continue to be actively involved as salinity control in the San Joaquin River Basin is of key interest to us and for the long-term management of the Vernalis Adaptive Management Plan (VAMP), a major component of our efforts to improve salmon survival in the lower San Joaquin River.

The SJRGA would like to join the Coalition as we feel everyone needs to be part of developing a solution to salt management in the basin. Enclosed is a check for \$25,000 for our membership. The SJRGA is made up of a number of water entities who collectively do not discharge a significant proportion of the salt finding its way into the lower San Joaquin River but do manage a major component of the flow that will likely be needed as part of developing any solution to the salt management problems in the lower San Joaquin River. Even though many of our members are already participating in the Coalition through other groups and associations, the SJRGA feels our membership is beneficial as it will allow the Coalition to hear a variety of opinions and ideas on salt management.

Over the last year the SJRGA has been actively supporting the Coalition efforts by directly funding the completion of the Hoffman study on crop salt tolerance that will be a cornerstone procedure that the Coalition and stakeholders will be using to define protection levels for agriculture not only in the San Joaquin River Basin but throughout the entire Central Valley. The SJRGA is also prepared to make staff time available to assist in the Coalition and stakeholder efforts to successfully develop a salt management strategy for the San Joaquin River Basin.

Both the SJRGA and the Coalition have a mutual interest in the successful completion of a salt management strategy for the San Joaquin River Basin. It is critical that all efforts on the San Joaquin River, such as the Upstream Objectives study, the MAA effort between the Regional Board and the USBR, and the Real-time Management efforts on the San Joaquin River be brought under the coordination and possibly management of the Coalition in order to prevent piece-meal efforts being developed that have previously resulted in fragmented approaches to salinity management on the San Joaquin River.

We look forward to continued cooperation in the stakeholder effort and a positive response to our request to be part of the CV-SALTS Coalition. I will be acting as the lead person for the SJRGA in the Coalition and stakeholder process. If you have any questions regarding this request, please do not hesitate to contact me.

RE: Contribution to the Central Valley Salinity Coalition, Inc.

We are in receipt of your letter dated July 1, 2009, requesting a \$10,000 contribution by the Mountain House Community Services District (MHCSD) to the Central Valley Salinity Coalition.

Due to budget and revenue constraints, we have had to take drastic measures to reduce our spending and be able to provide the necessary services to the community. We have implemented such measures as placing 70% of our traffic signals on flashing red and turning off 75% of the street lights on arterial streets. The MHCSD has laid off 42% of its full time employees and has reduced the contracts with our consultants and contractors providing services to Mountain House to a minimum. We have eliminated or reduced all travel, training, and many other non-essential budget items.

The MHCSD has not budgeted any funds for this contribution and we do not have any major industrial dischargers that we can approach for any such contributions. The MHCSD's effluent discharge permit does stipulate that we are to consider participating financially in the development of the Central Valley Salinity Management Plan at a level commensurate with our contribution of salinity to the Southern Delta. We are discharging less than .5 MGD and do not expect this to increase drastically within the next few years.

Therefore, I am sorry to say that we can not contribute \$10,000 to the Central Valley Salinity Coalition. However, in order to support the efforts of the CVSC and to help meet our permit requirements, we will contribute \$1,000 to CVSC.
